



“ Mira, ya creció, ahora es una butterfly ”

The "World of Change" began when our classroom suddenly changed. The girls discovered that something they see every day can one day be different. They began to wonder things like, "Why is it different?" and "Can it change again?" From that moment, they started exploring change in their everyday lives.

Guided by Lila the caterpillar, they investigated change in animals, plants, and themselves. They observed the butterfly life cycle, planted and cared for seeds, and reflected on their own growth.

Through play, exploration, and creation, the girls observed, compared, and represented their ideas. They developed an understanding that change happens in everyday life and in everything around them.

Teacher's reflection

Throughout the project, the girls developed observation, comparison, and early scientific thinking skills. They asked questions, made connections, and expressed their ideas through art, play, and exploration.

It was meaningful to see how they began to understand that change is everywhere—recognizing it in plant growth, the butterfly's transformation, themselves, and the world around them. They also strengthened their sense of identity by noticing the changes in their own lives and in their families.
