Through the story of Alana, a curious little traveler, the girls embarked on an adventure around the world. As Alana visited countries like Japan, Kenya, Colombia, Australia, and Norway, the girls explored different cultures, traditions, landscapes, and ways of life.

Their curiosity led them to ask questions, make connections, and share their own ideas: How do people live in other places? What do they eat? How do they celebrate? What is different? What is similar to us?

They built their understanding of diversity, discovering that learning from others helps us grow, understand, and connect with the world in meaningful ways..

Teacher's reflection

This project fostered the girls' natural curiosity and strengthened their ability to observe, question, and make connections. Through play, exploration, art, storytelling, and hands-on experiences, they engaged in a cycle of inquiry while developing key skills such as critical thinking, communication, creativity, and collaboration.

It was especially meaningful to see how they began to understand diversity —not just as differences, but as something valuable that enriches our lives. They showed empathy and openness when learning about other cultures, recognizing similarities and differences with respect and curiosity.

Using Alana's journey as a bridge, the girls expressed their own ideas and experiences, demonstrating a growing awareness of the world and their place within it.

This project highlighted that meaningful learning happens when children are given opportunities to explore, imagine, and connect their discoveries to real life.
